Essential Question: How do cultural beliefs and values guide people?

Focusing Question: What important beliefs and values guide Chief Joseph and his daughter,

Sound of Running Feet?

Standards: Interpret quotes, Character/setting/problem analysis, figurative language, informational writing (hook, topic sentences, text evidence, elaboration, transition sentences).

This week in ELA students will analyze Chief Joseph's Lincoln Hall Speech. This is the speech students will use for the End Of Module task (handout 29A). We will identify and analyze repeated words and phrases and analyze what they mean. The previous lesson on mood/tone will help to further their analysis.

Students will finally begin to plan out their essay and find evidence that will support their analysis of Chief Joseph's speech. Their evidence will need to support how the speech conveys two important beliefs and values of the Nez Perce people.
