In Spanish class, your child will be learning about the Day of the Dead holiday which is celebrated in parts of Mexico and Latin America at the end of October through the beginning of November. We will read stories about the celebration, and each grade level will produce traditional artwork that is typically associated with this holiday. The students will discover that the Day of the Dead celebration is a jubilant and festive tradition that unites families and establishes a sense of identity. It is a time for happy memories of loved ones, not scary stories! Families make special foods and picnic at the graves of their loved ones. In this way, the festival is similar to the manner Memorial Day is celebrated in the United States. By studying the art and culture of Mexico as part of our curriculum and learning about this celebration, I hope to create an exciting cultural experience for your child.

Please consider attending Cheekwood's annual "Día de los Muertos" celebration which will be held on Saturday, October 28 - Sunday, October 29 from 9:00am - 5:00pm. It is a fun celebration with entertainment, art activities, exhibits, vendors, food and more! They often sell out so reservations are highly recommended.
