5.NBT.A.3 Read and write decimals to thousandths using standard form, word form, and expanded notation (e.g., the expanded notation of 347.392 is written as $(3 \times 100) + (4 \times 10) + (7 \times 1) + (3 \times (1/10)) + (9 \times (1/100)) + (2 \times (1/1000))$). Essential Question: How and why do writers play with words?

Focusing Question: How can wordplay create confusion and humor?

This week in ELA we will continue our study of wordplay. Lessons 1-6 have students build critical background knowledge of wordplay through riddles, idioms, and puns.
